Success Highlights by Program Suite

STRONG: 93% Girl participants demonstrate knowledge about reproductive health and can describe components of healthy living that ensure their health and positive body image.

SMART: 86% Girl participants are able to identify how to manage, invest and save money to become economically self-sustaining and help others through philanthropy.

BOLD: 91% Girl participants are able to identify the difference between gender-stereotyped views and gender-equitable views to promote increased self-esteem and self-concept.

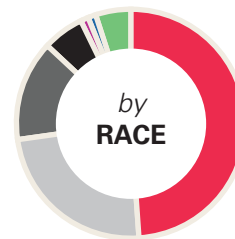
STRONG 145 programs delivered 1,701 girls*

SMART 100 programs delivered 1,241 girls*

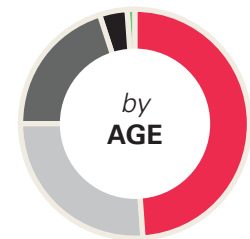
BOLD 162 programs delivered 1,753 girls*

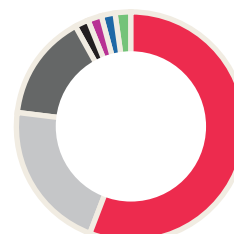
Volunteers

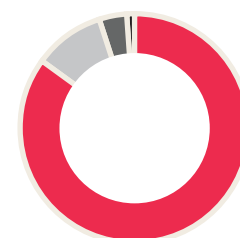

2015 Highlight

Girls Inc. of Greater Indianapolis received a \$2,000,000 grant from Lilly Endowment, Inc. to distribute its **Work It Out** and **Redefining Beauty** curriculum to Indiana Girls Inc. affiliates. \$950,655 of this grant will partially provide three years of program support to serve Greater Indianapolis girls and upgrade program/volunteer technology platforms. The remaining dollars will be granted to other Girls Inc. affiliates to fund their outreach and program efforts to better serve girls in the State of Indiana.

Affiliates include: Girls Inc. of Monroe County, Girls Inc. of Wayne County, Girls Inc. of Shelbyville/Shelby County, Girls Inc. of Jackson County, Girls Inc. of Johnson County and Girls Inc. of Jefferson County.
