

LEOPARD PRINT NAIL ART

Ages:

9-11, 12-14, 15-18

Description:

Participants will learn how to do leopard print nails.

Time:

30-45 minutes

Materials Needed:

- Nail polish (3 colors)
 - OR nail polish (1 color) + acrylic paint (2 colors)
- One or more of the following:
 - Bobby pin
 - Toothpick
 - Dotting tools
- One of the following to serve as a palette:
 - Wax-coated paper plate
 - Plastic palette (example [here](#))
- Nail polish remover



Instructions

Nail art is a fun way to express your creativity on your nails! Today you'll learn how to do leopard print nails!


Let's get started!

Nail Art Guide

Follow the steps below to complete your nail art masterpiece!

Leopard Print Nails!	Time: 30-45 minutes Skill Level: Beginner	
Step 1	Remove any existing nail polish with nail polish remover.	
Step 2	If you have a base coat, apply that first.	
Step 3	Pick a nail polish color that you'd like to use as the base for your design. It can be any color you choose, but you'll want to pick a color that goes well with the 2 colors you've chosen to do the leopard print. Paint 2 coats and let your nails dry for 5 minutes.	

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<p>Materials Tip 1</p>	<p>For most of my designs, I use acrylic paint for the details instead of nail polish. If you've used nail polish to do nail art before, you may have noticed that it starts to dry and get a little tacky-tacky. Acrylic paint is a great alternative, as it doesn't dry out or get tacky when it's in your palette (see below), but once you paint a design onto your nails with acrylic paint, it dries quickly! Another benefit is that it allows you to custom mix your own colors.</p>	
<p>Materials Tip 2</p>	<p>I've included a picture of the palette I use for doing nail art. This is what I put my acrylic paint into. When I use nail polish for a design, I use something like a wax-coated paper plate, because it would be harder to remove polish from my plastic palette! The acrylic paint, once dried, pops out easily later.</p>	
<p>Materials Tip 3</p>	<p>You can use a bobby pin to do this design, but you may also consider using dotting tools, which are made for doing all sorts of art. They have different sizes of rounded tips, which are great for doing polka dots, flowers, and all kinds of other designs. If you'd like to order your own set, they can be found for around \$5 on Amazon here. Along with my small brushes, my dotting tools are an essential part of my nail art materials.</p>	

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<p>Step 4</p>	<p>Using your second color, start off by placing several irregular shaped dots on each nail.</p>	
<p>Step 5</p>	<p>Next, using your third color (a dark color works best), place a C-shaped marking around a dot.</p>	
<p>Step 6</p>	<p>Make 2 additional C-shaped markings around the dot, trying not to connect each C-shape (there should be a little space in between each dot).</p>	
<p>Step 7</p>	<p>Continue adding the C-shaped markings around all of your dots. Using the same color, place some additional dots in the blank spaces around your leopard print.</p>	
<p>Step 8</p>	<p>Continue until you've finished each finger. It should look something like this.</p>	

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Step 8	Once your design is finished, seal your nails (and protect them!) with a topcoat.

- Which colors did you pick for your design? What additional elements would you add next time—ombre under the leopard print? Something else?
