





Dear Parent/Guardian,

Girls Inc. of Greater Indianapolis (GIGI) would like to invite your teen to apply for the *Eureka!* Program to grow and nurture their interest in science, technology, engineering & mathematics (STEM) and prepare them to be strong, smart, and bold leaders. *Eureka!* builds girls' confidence and skills through fun, hands-on STEM activities and field trips. Additionally, *Eureka!* fosters personal development and college and career readiness, promotes lasting relationships with peers and mentors and encourages positive risk-taking. Within a cohort of 30 peers, "Eurekans" will be inspired to pursue educational, professional, and personal growth.

For the 2023-2024 program year, we are recruiting 30 current 7th and 8th graders to join the program.

ORGANIZATION OVERVIEW

Girls Inc. of Greater Indianapolis is a non-profit organization that inspires all girls to be **strong**, **smart**, and **bold**. We empower program participants to be confident in their own skin, prepared for their futures, proud of who they are, and ready to take their place in the world through our programming. We offer holistic, comprehensive programming for girls ages 6-24 in a **safe**, **pro-girl**, **girl-centered** environment utilizing our trained staff and volunteers; curriculum focused on academic enrichment and support, leadership, healthy living, and life skills instruction, and our vast network of community and corporate partners.

We serve girls who need us most – girls who wouldn't otherwise have access to the opportunities, experiences, or mentors to envision and reach their dreams. We support girls individually and work to change the system collectively to ensure an equitable future for girls, young women, and marginalized youth to thrive.

GIGI is committed to providing the comprehensive Girls Inc. experience to young people who feel safe in a pro-girl and girl-centered environment. GIGI programming serves youth whose gender and gender identities have been historically marginalized, including those who identify as girls (regardless of their assigned sex at birth), non-binary youth, gender non-conforming youth, and/or youth exploring their gender identity or expression.

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Eureka! is a year-round, 5-year STEM-based program for middle and high school students provided at a low cost for families (\$0-\$125 a year based on financial need). **The program builds girls' confidence and skills in science, technology, engineering, and math; prepares them to pursue STEM-related careers; become leaders in their communities; and lead healthy, independent lives.** Within a cohort of 30 peers, girls enter the *Eureka!* program the summer before their 8th-grade year and continue in the program through high school graduation.







Participants in years 1-3 of the program (8th, 9th, and 10th graders) start each program year with a four-week summer camp on a college campus and engage in:

- **fun, hands-on STEM activities and experiments** with our community and corporate partners, such as Eli Lilly, Cummins, and First Robotics;
- exciting field trips such as ziplining and rock climbing;
- eye-opening job shadowing and career development experiences;
- participant-led leadership projects and workshops;
- high school and college readiness workshops;
- and life skills activities and workshops focused on self-defense, healthy cooking, financial literacy, and more!

In year 4, the program participants (11th graders) complete a **four-week, paid internship** with our community and corporate partners aligned with their career interests. In 2022, participants completed their internships at companies such as Azenta Life Sciences, Cox Automotive, Resultant, VMS BioMarketing, and Pivot Marketing.

In year 5, program participants (12th graders) can complete another paid summer internship (STEM-related or outside of STEM) or enroll in a **summer dual credit course** on a local college campus.

Outside of summer activities, all participants are required to attend monthly workshops and mentoring sessions during the school year at the Girls Inc. Indy office and participate in additional field trips, such as college tours, to further their educational, professional, and personal growth.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

To apply, interested youth and a parent/guardian must submit a completed application, which includes a commitment agreement for the 5-year program, and at least one letter of recommendation from a teacher, coach, or another adult in the youth's life that is not a relative. Applicants and a parent/guardian will then participate in an interview that will be conducted online or via phone.

The ideal applicant for the Eureka! program is someone who:

- can commit to a 5-year, summer and school-year experience;
- has an interest and motivation to explore science, technology, engineering, and math fields;
- is currently in 7th grade or 8th grade and attends school within and around Marion County
- has reliable transportation to the GIGI office (3935 N. Meridian St., Indianapolis, IN 46208) (school-year) and IUPUI School of Informatics (535 W Michigan St, Indianapolis, IN 46202) (summer) for programming;
- can attend the 2023 Summer Camp (June 12 July 7, 2023, 7:30am 5:30pm, M-F);
- can attend monthly Saturday workshops during the school-year (September May);
- will benefit from building stronger relationships with peers and enjoy in-depth learning experiences.

FAQ: FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Five years is a long time! I don't know if I can make that commitment. Should I still apply? We expect participants to commit to the 5-year experience. If you are interested in STEM, want to become a leader, prepare for your future, make new friends, and have fun, this is an excellent opportunity! New Eureka! participants end up loving the program so much that they continue through the program without thinking about the time commitment. We will have our first 5th-year cohort this year!

Do I have to be "good" at math or science to join Eureka!?

As long as you are interested in learning more about STEM and want to improve, we would love to have you in the program. The purpose of Eureka! is to build girls' confidence and skills in STEM through fun, interactive activities, and field trips. It's not a matter of being good or bad; it's about trying your best. We will connect you and your family with resources to help you succeed in and out of Eureka!

I'm currently in 9th grade. Can I still join Eureka!?

No. Only current 7th and 8th graders are eligible to join the Eureka! program.

We have another high school program called Young Women in Leadership (YWIL), which is open to 9-12 graders. YWIL is a school-year program focused on leadership development and college and career readiness. For more information on the YWIL program, email leaders@girlsincindy.org.

What if I can't attend all the summer camp and school year meetings?

All participants are required to attend 90% of summer camp meetings and 80% of school-year meetings.

The Eureka! Coordinators will track participants' attendance rates and notify them when their attendance rate falls below the attendance requirement. Participants whose attendance falls below the required attendance rate must complete a makeup activity or project, such as attending a community or STEM event, interviewing a woman in a STEM career, journaling, etc.

What if I am no longer interested in STEM the further I get in the program? Can I still participate?

Suppose a participant completes year 2 or 3 of the program and finds that they are no longer interested in STEM. In that case, we still highly encourage participation in the remainder of the program because years 4 and 5 of the program focus more heavily on college and career preparedness through workshops, internships, overnight college visits, and dual credit opportunities. Participants who drop out of the program after years 2 or 3 will miss critical experiences and opportunities that will help them prepare and transition to adulthood.

What if I don't have reliable transportation to get to Eureka! sessions?

Participants must have reliable transportation to and from Eureka! meetings and events. Many participants carpool with one another. Girls Inc. Indy may provide transportation assistance via bus







passes for participants living near bus lines.

How will interviews be conducted?

If selected as a finalist, all applicants must participate in a final interview. Interviews will be conducted virtually (i.e., Zoom) and via phone for families without access to the internet. Interviews will be conducted on **Friday, April 7th**, **Friday, April 14th**, and **Saturday, April 15th**. Girls Inc. staff will contact to applicants to schedule interviews by **Tuesday, April 4th**.

I am already participating in another intensive/immersive program/sport/activity. Can I still be in Eureka?

Yes, however, participating in two or more programs, sports, or activities that require a big commitment will be challenging. We encourage you to speak with your family about what it would take to balance all your commitments before you apply. Eureka should not be the lowest priority.

How can I write a strong application?

- Remember you are unique, and your experiences leading up to today shape your view of the world.
- Be authentic in your responses and willing to share these views.
- Adhere to word limitations.
- Plan ahead and allow yourself enough time to gather information such as recommendation letters.
- Identify ahead of time whom to ask for letters of support and give them plenty of advance notice to write your recommendation.
- Be sure to hold important dates on your calendar, such as the application deadline, interview and program dates.


